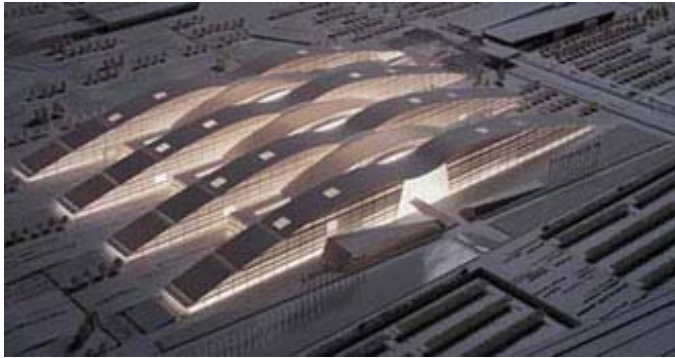


## New NATO Headquarters Project:



### Why a new NATO Headquarters ?

Current Headquarters is no longer adaptable to NATO's needs. Difficulty in accommodating future NATO enlargement and Alliance's evolving tasks;  
Decision by Heads of State and Government at 1999 Washington Summit "to build a new NATO Headquarters to meet the requirements of the Alliance in the 21st century";



### Where will it be built ?

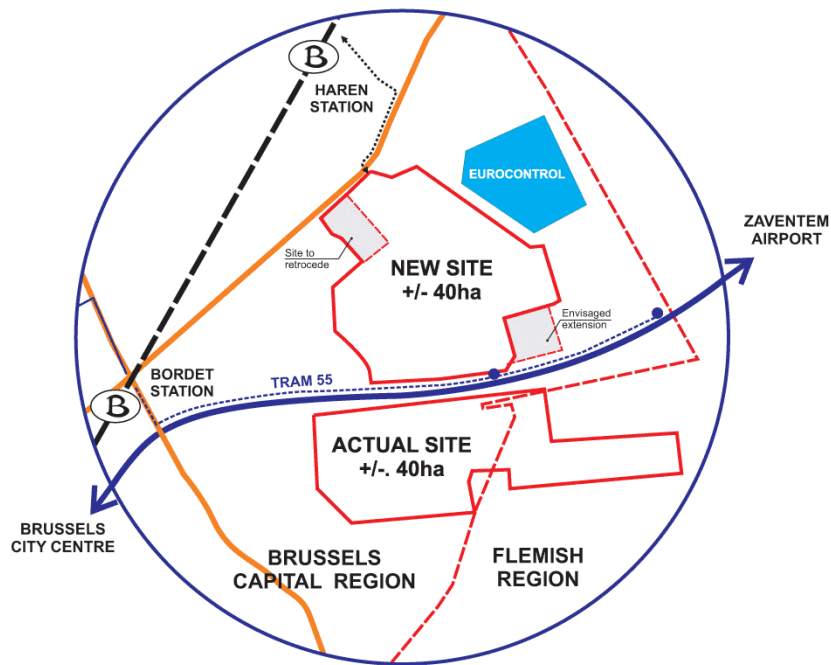
On the 40 hectares Roi Albert I Royal Airforce site located opposite the current NATO Headquarters granted to NATO in concession by the Host Nation, Belgium ;

### What will it comprise ?

Up-to-date conference facilities; office accommodation for Delegations, Military Representations, International Staff (IS) and International Military Staff (IMS), Agencies and Partner Missions; modern, up-to-date communications and IT facilities.

### Surfaces :

Approximately 172,000m<sup>2</sup> (additional option of 4,400 m<sup>2</sup> for enlargement) including :  
111,500m<sup>2</sup> for Offices, 19,500m<sup>2</sup> for the Conference Centre, 24,800m<sup>2</sup> for the Common Facilities, 9,300m<sup>2</sup> for the Staff Centre.



### What happens to the old NATO-site???
